The Goal of the Capital Area College Access Network (CapCAN) is to increase college and career readiness, participation and completion particularly among low-income, first generation college-going students, and students of color.

CapCAN defines college as all post-secondary education including certificate programs, trades and degrees.

Eaton > 41.5%

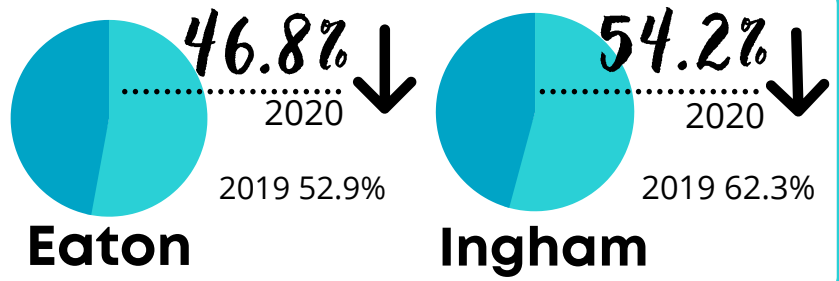

Increase percentage of students who enroll in college within one year of high school graduation.

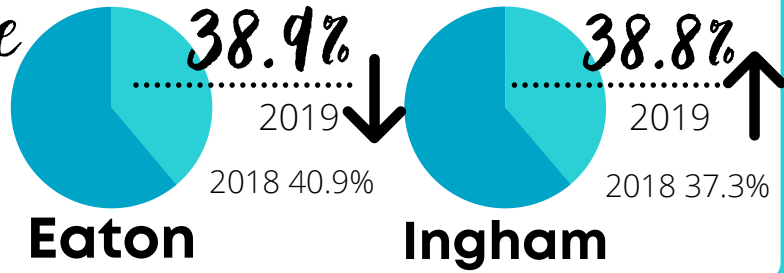

Increase percentage of students enrolled in college who persist towards degree completion.

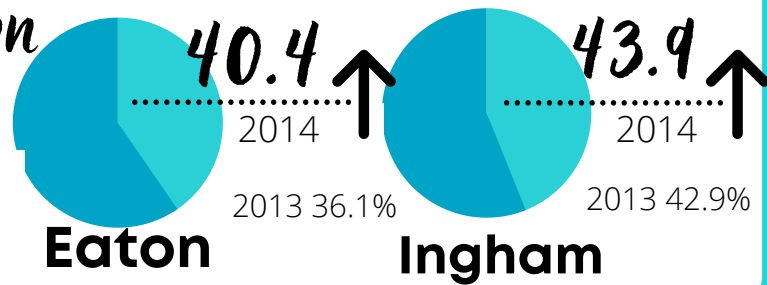

Goal Three: College Completion

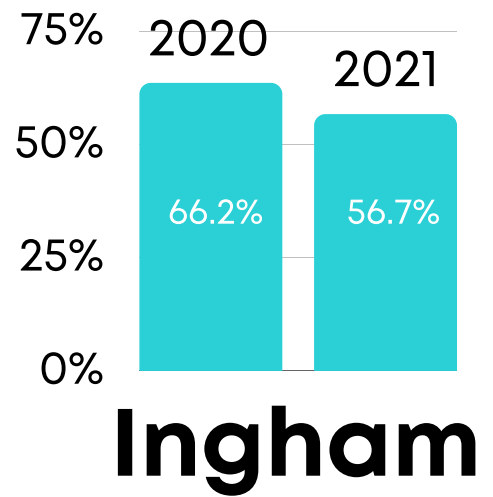
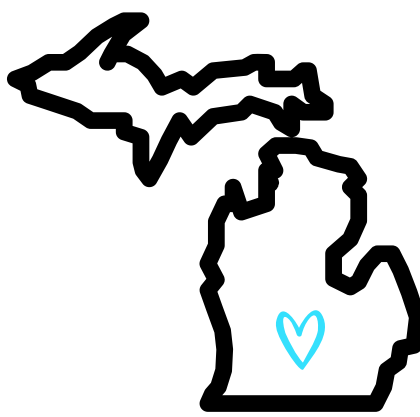
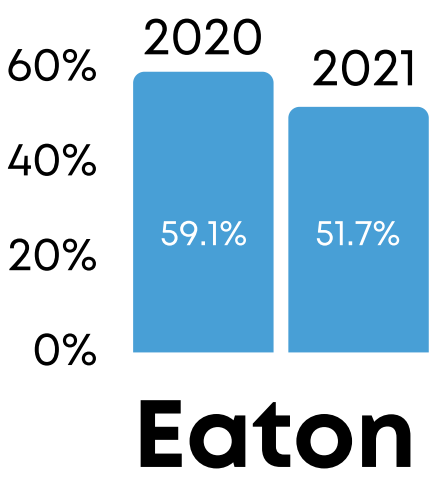
Increase percentage of high school graduates who complete a post-secondary certificate or degree within 6 years.

Every student is financially prepared to complete a degree or credential.

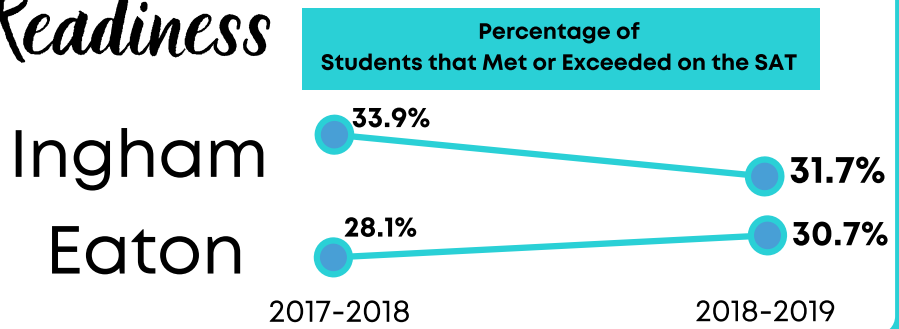
