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Retired & Senior Volunteer Programs of Ingham, Eaton & Clinton Counties (RSVP)

Retired & Senior Volunteer Programs of Ingham, Eaton & Clinton Counties has been serving our community for over 50 years. We have three programs that we administer for senior volunteers, RSVP, Foster Grandparents, and Senior Companions. We are affiliated with national AmeriCorps Seniors and state Aging & Adult Services Agency (AASA) programs.

AmeriCorps Seniors is the largest volunteer network in the nation for people 55 years and older. Seniors use their skills and talents learned over the years or develop new ones while serving in a variety of volunteer activities in the Tri-County area.

RSVP Program: RSVP volunteers have opportunities to serve at the local hospitals, Meals on Wheels, Salvation Army Food Banks and Kitchens, the Capital Region International Airport, Lansing Police Department and River Trail Patrol, knitting and sewing items while at home, that are donated to the needy. Our volunteers assist at Potter Park Zoo, Impression 5 Museum, and make toys for needy children. Just to name a few of the many places you can volunteer.

RSVP Volunteers choose how, where, and when they want to serve, with a various range of hourly commitments. Volunteers will receive pre-service orientation, training, and supplemental insurance while they serve.

Foster Grandparent Program (FGP): FGP is an intergenerational program in which the volunteers serve as role models, mentors, and friends to children in schools, preschools, and daycare centers within the community.

To become an FGP Volunteer you must be 55+, commit to serve 20 hrs. per wk., and meet all income, health, and background check requirements.

FGP Volunteers receive pre-service orientation, training, and supplemental insurance while they serve, and may be eligible to earn a tax-free hourly stipend.

Senior Companion Program (SCP): SCP consists of volunteers who provide assistance and friendship to seniors to support independence and community engagement from serving at nursing facilities to make telephone reassurance calls. SCP Volunteers serve locally and are provided with pre-service orientation, training, supplemental insurance while they serve, and may qualify to earn a tax-free hourly stipend.

To become an SCP Volunteer, you must be 55+, commit to serve 20 hrs. per wk., and meet all income, health, and background check requirements.
